Executive Director's Message: Rev. Dr. Ron Barnes, LSW

A Communal Call for Emotional, Relational, and Spiritual Peace

Meeting the needs of the community is how Anchorpoint began its mission almost fifty years ago. In 2016, we continued to expand our services to the greater northern area of Pittsburgh by offering more therapeutic and educational support groups. One of the commonalities in many of our clients is the issue of isolation. Our society continues to prioritize independence over interdependence which results in loneliness, lack of community and isolation. Our goal is to help our clients experience emotional, relational and spiritual peace in their lives.

Anchorpoint Counseling Ministry (ACM) is a Christian-based para-church ministry that is connected to and supported by many churches. This ministry was begun by sixteen churches working together to create Anchorpoint (previously North Hills Youth Ministry) as an outreach to teenagers who were not involved with a church or who were active in the drug culture of the late 60's, a culture that influenced considerable rebellion. The community of churches stepped it up and reached out and created a place, a community, for teens to gather and have music (a coffee house) and a place to dance. Adults were there to informally reach out and engage with teenagers through caring, connecting, Bible studies and fun activities. The idea took hold and fifty years later we are still stressing the importance of community. The Bible teaches us about Pentecost, the birthday of the church (the Christian Community). Anchorpoint's model of ministry is to be communal and to encourage communal involvement for all our clients through counseling, tutoring, parent education and through our growing number of therapeutic and educational support groups.

Jesus, the Blessed Child of the Father, is a peacemaker. His peace doesn't mean only absence of war. It is not simply harmony or equilibrium. His peace is the fullness of wellbeing, gratuitously

given by God. Jesus says, "Peace I leave to you, my own peace I give you, a peace which the world cannot give, this is my gift to you." (John 14:27) Peace is Shalom —well-being of mind, heart, and body, individually and communally. It can exist in the midst of a war-torn world, even in the midst of unresolved problems and increasing human conflicts. Jesus made that peace by giving His life for His brothers and sisters. This is no easy peace, but it is everlasting and it comes from God. Are we willing to give our lives in the service of peace?

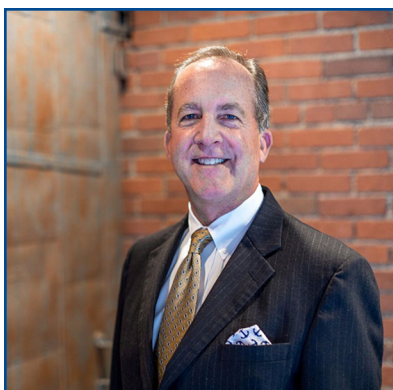

In 2016 ACM served approximately 440 families through our counseling services. This amounted to roughly 2700 counseling sessions. We also counseled with approximately another 100 people through the various therapeutic groups that we facilitate.

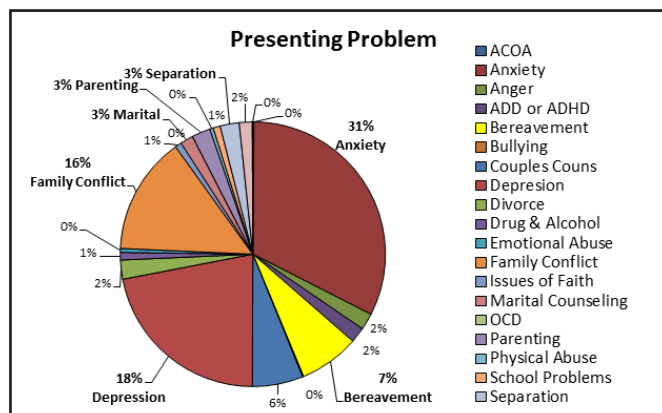
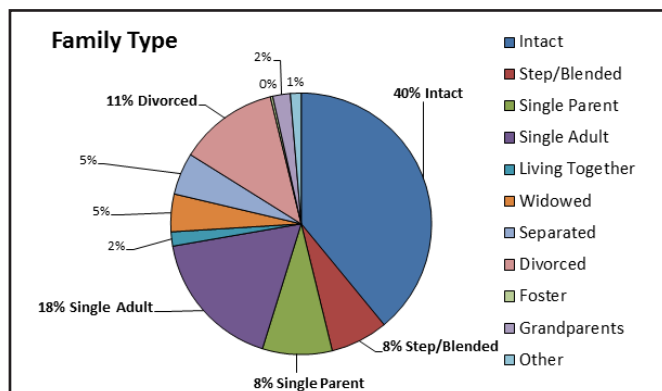
Anchorpoint continued to broaden it's scope of services in 2016 by adding several new therapeutic support groups and by counseling with more people over the age of 65.

Traditionally, Anchorpoint was created to serve the needs of teens and over the past 50 years we certainly have prioritized working with teens, but from a much more family therapy based perspective. Families come in all shapes and sizes with many differing issues and we have worked to meet the many needs of our clients.

Anchorpoint works on a relational model with belief that people need to be connected in a healthy way. Attachment, belonging and caring are tremendous needs for us all. Anchorpoint addresses these needs every day through our Christian ministry perspective.

"Christ came that we might have life and have it abundantly," states John 10:10. This is life in relationships with Him and with others. Anchorpoint's name and mission are based on the goal of being anchored in Christ (Hebrews 6:19). As we are anchored in Him, we are grounded, integrated and capable of receiving love and providing love to others.

You enabled us to offer over \$100,000 of free and subsidized services to families in our area. Thank you!





Support Groups & Education

Your generosity helps the therapy and education groups continue to grow and expand to meet community needs. These groups and workshops are an important part of prevention and healing. Topics are determined with input from our clinicians as well as requests from clergy, church groups, school guidance counselors, teachers, and other community partners. Anchorpoint's longest consistently running group, **Grief Support for Widows and Widowers over Fifty**, has been meeting at St. Sebastian Parish in Ross for well over ten years.

One of our most popular therapy groups, **Self-Care Group for Women**, continues to grow and expand. In assessing needs, it was determined that two slightly different groups would better fill the needs of the many eager participants. The first group is an eight week group that feels almost like a workshop. It is called the **Self-Care Skills Group for Women** and it boasts a fun and interactive way to learn boundaries, self-esteem, mindfulness, and stress coping skills. The second group, **Self-Care In Action**, is a group for women who enjoyed the **Self-Care Skills Group** so much that they want to continue group work on an ongoing basis. Women in this group work to apply said skills to everyday life while supported by a nurturing therapy group. Members set the pace of this group and decide when they are ready to graduate.

Sanctuary, our therapeutic group for teens, has also had a number of changes this year. With a swelling number of female registrants, the group has necessarily become a girls-only group, giving the girls an opportunity to delve more deeply into group topics such as self-esteem, body image, values, challenging negative thinking styles, depression symptoms, and more. **Sanctuary** ran three times in 2016, and the small group size has allowed for deep and healing discussions on the part of the participants.

SPIN (Single Parent Information Network) for single moms and their kids has also grown and expanded in 2016; so much so that a second **SPIN** group is now being offered at Heritage Church in Franklin Park. Between the group at ACM and the group at Heritage Church, ACM dedicates an entire evening per week to nurturing single moms. A delicious dinner is prepared for the moms and their kids. Child care and homework help is provided while the moms attend a much needed support group with other moms. All this is at no cost to the single moms because of the generosity of supporters like you.

Anchorpoint continues to venture into the cyberworld, this time with a new Facebook group designed to provide support, education, and a connection to Anchorpoint for North Hills parents. The group is called **Plugged-In-Parents**, and it's gathered a quick following of just under a hundred people. The hope is that this group will continue to grow, linking parents with parenting workshops, counseling, tutoring, and parent coaching programs at ACM.

Single Parent Coaching and **Parenting Hot Topic Workshops** also continue to be offered to those wanting to improve their parenting skills. Staff members have also been invited to speak at local schools, churches and organizations on various mental health topics and the services Anchorpoint offers to the community.

Tutoring & Mentoring

One word comes to mind when thinking about the 2016 Tutoring Program...MATH !!...lots and lots of math tutoring! Similar to the past few years, math was once again the #1 most requested subject for tutoring. Thank goodness for our talented tutors who willingly (and enthusiastically) tackled hours and hours of math assignments, along with providing support in reading, spelling, grammar, composition skills, science, and social studies.

Our dedicated tutors are the HEART of our tutoring program. This past year, 50 volunteers, along with 6-9 paid part-time teachers, provided over 1,962 hours of instruction. A total of 93 students received tutoring in our school year and summer programs. Tutors not only worked to improve their students' grades, but they strived to help their students become more independent, confident learners. As MENTORS, the tutors tried to combine academic support with empathy, motivation, and humor in order to establish a comfortable, trusting rapport with their students. Some tutors attended band concerts or sporting events that their students were participating in; other tutors brought in little rewards for their students to celebrate a good grade on a test or a birthday. A middle school student explained it best: *"I like working with my tutor because he doesn't get mad when I don't know something. He's funny, too. He tells really funny jokes while we're working!"*



With every year that goes by, our Anchorpoint Tutoring Program becomes even more of a go-to resource for local school districts and parents. They appreciate our one-on-one personalized instruction, our affordable rates, and our willingness to work with the schools in order to best help a student. Parents are especially grateful for our knowledgeable, committed tutors. One parent wrote, *"I can't say how appreciative I am of the tutors and staff at Anchorpoint. Everything is done for each individual student with love and care to bring out the best in each child. A true example of faith in action!"*

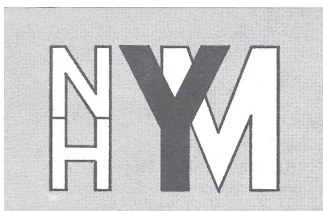

This number grew to 40 Protestant & Catholic churches under Rev. Brown's leadership. These vital church relationships continue to grow, change, and form today.

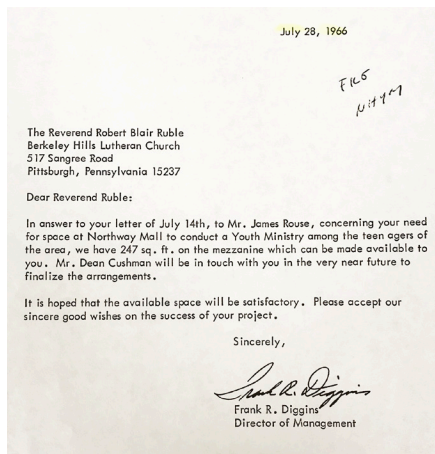

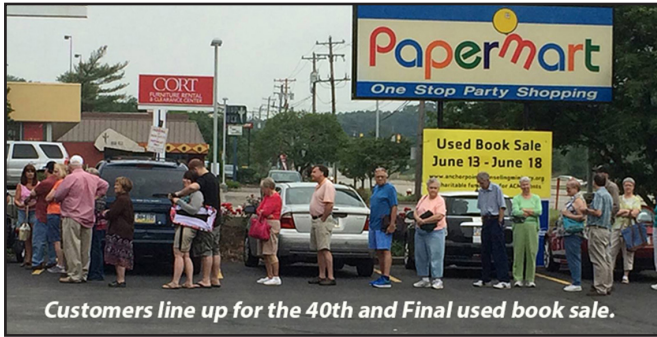
Early 1970's

- Dale Sewall becomes our second director in 1972.
- NHYM moved away from Young Life Model to focus on alienated kids.
- Heavy use of trained volunteers - both adult and teen.
- Coffee House Era began.



Late 1970's and early 80's

- Randy Younkin became acting director in 1976
- Annual Used Book Sale begins. This event would run for 40 years until 2015.



- John Rickloff became director in 1978.
- Focus on professional youth ministry began.
- Rickloff focused on teen drug prevention. He worked with school counselors to educate them about drug and alcohol intervention.
- After Care Programs were created to help teens remain clean.
- Counseling was made available on site at a number of high schools and NHYM worked alongside school counselors well into the mid-nineties.

Late 1980's

- Linda Stone Neuenschwander became acting director in 1986
- Teen counseling with parents and after care programming continued.
- Moving-In Program started for kids new to the North Hills area.



- Rev. Ron Barnes selected as our executive director in 1987. Ron is our longest serving executive director.



- Counseling Staff was enlarged to meet community needs.
- Due to counseling including parents, the need for more marital counseling resulted. Sister Mary Jane Beatty came on board as a marital family therapist in 1989 and has been with us for over 27 years.

- Our Graduate School Intern Program started and we began to mentor future therapists who have a desire to integrate the resources of faith into their counseling with clients.

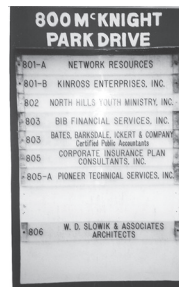

1990's



- Our name was changed to North Hills Youth Ministry Counseling Center to emphasize our identity as a Christian counseling center.
- In 1992, we moved to our current location in McKnight East Complex.



- First Golf Classic Tournament held in 1992. In 2016 we celebrated 25 years of this event.



- Counseling continued to broaden to include younger children and their families. More counselors were hired as a result of moving towards a family therapy model.
- Joan Schenker was hired in 1992 as Parent Education Coordinator. She oversaw the development and implementation of parenting classes for the next 25 years.



2000's

- Youth Development Program established in 2001. The need for low cost tutoring for our clients with academic problems became evident. Sandy Niekum was hired as our tutoring Coordinator.
- We expanded our space to an adjoining condo and in 2005 we expanded again into two more condos to meet the needs of our growing ministry.
- In 2009, we changed our name to Anchorpoint Counseling Ministry based on Hebrews 6:19. This new name more accurately reflects the current scope of services offered to the whole family as well as individuals.



- Private parent coaching and SPIN (Single Parent Information Network) were added to support the growing needs of single parent families.
- Some form of support group therapy has always existed at ACM; however, in 2015 there was a renewed commitment to focus on and formulate new groups to meet the additional needs of the North Hills community.

- In 2013, we held our first Golden Anchor Gala. The honorees that year were:

Lighthouse Electric, A Business that Brings Hope
North Hills Community Baptist Church, A Faith Community that Brings Hope



- In late 2015, we honored our longest serving board member, Richard Bruckman. Dick served Anchorpoint as our treasurer for nearly 50 years before retiring!
- In the fall of 2016, our first Hope Scholarship was awarded in gratitude for 50 years of ministry. The recipient was Russell Parris, a 12th student in our youth development program.

- Girl with fears of going to college.
- Boy cynical and unsure about God. Wants to talk.
- Boy with homosexual issues.
- Unwed mother wanting help.
- Boy who feels life is empty and he's messed up. Looking for meaning in life.
- Girl who says friends are spreading rumors about her.

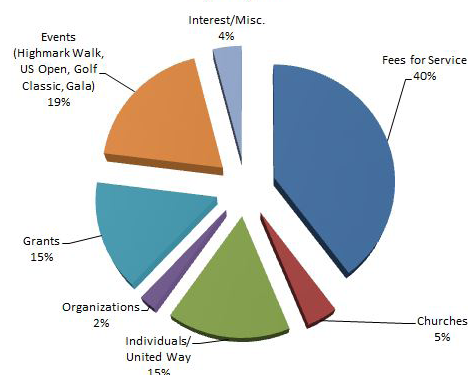

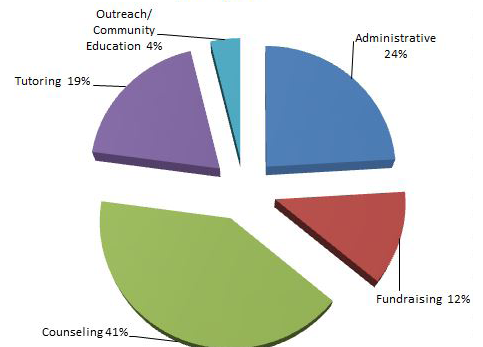
